PEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the competition horse.



FEI tests don't always align directly with EA levels, however riders should be aware that they can only ride over 2 consecutive FEI test levels (eg Prix St Georges/ Inter I) at any competition. For the purpose of competing at the Victorian Youth Dressage Championships the comparative levels are: (Note that qualifying performances need to be submitted at the following levels)

FEI Pony – Elementary
FEI Junior – Medium
FEI Young Rider – Prix St-Georges

FEI Pony. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 12 until the end of the year the rider turns 16 years old. Scheduled classes - FEI Team Competition (2018), FEI Individual Competition (2018) & FEI Freestyle Pony Riders (2009 update 2017)

FEI Junior. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 14 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 18 years old. Scheduled classes FEI Team Test (2018) FEI Individual Competition (2018) & FEI Freestyle Junior (2009 update 2017)

FEI Young Rider. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 21 years old. Scheduled classes- FEI YR Team Competition (Prix St Georges 2019), FEI YR Individual Competition (2018) & FEI Young Rider Freestyle (2009 update 2017)

Small Tour. FEI Prix St-Georges (2018), FEI Intermediate 1 (2020), FEI Intermediate 1 Freestyle (2009 update 2017) and is open to riders of any age as per conditions of entry.

Medium Tour. FEI Intermediate A (2020), FEI Intermediate B (2020), FEI Inter A / B Freestyle (2018) and is open to riders of any age as per conditions of entry.

U25 Grand Prix Tour. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 25 years old. FEI Intermediate II (2020), FEI U-25 Grand Prix (2018) & FEI Grand Prix Freestyle (2009 update 2017).

FREESTYLES

All horses must achieve a minimum score of 58% in the qualifying test to be eligible to start in the freestyle. More details are in the Conditions of Entry section on page 5

PAS DE DEUX

Costume dress is optional. However, boots and approved safety helmet must be worn. Time limit 5 minutess. Equal scores: If two entries receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the leader. Competitors must ride at the level of the most inexperienced rider i.e. If one rider is competing in Medium and the other in Novice, then the combination would compete at Novice level.



SPECIAL AWARDS AND TROPHIES

Deb Hamid & Kevin J Hitchins Award: Conditions of award to be advised. A competitor may only receive this award once. The recipient of the award will receive a magnificent piece of jewellery, hand crafted for this event by Deb Hamid and Kevin Hitchins. This award is valued in excess of \$1500 and is generously donated to recognise Australia's talented young riders who are the future of Australia's Dressage.

Briana Judge Memorial Trophy: Awarded to Highest placed EA & PCAV member at the Championships. Open to Victorian riders only with current memberships with Equestrian Victoria and PCAV. Donated by Mr & Mrs Judge, in loving memory of their daughter Briana Judge.

Taylor Farley Memorial: Awarded to the highest placed Victorian Junior (under 18 years) in the Novice Championship. Presented by the Farley family in memory of their daughter Taylor, who was an active and highly successful member of the EV YR Dressage Squad.

Highborn Baden Trophy: Awarded to the Victorian Rider who attains the highest overall percentage of the competition. Presented by the Barnes family, in memory of Marion's beautiful horse Highborn Baden ridden by Bianca.

Zarina Perpetual Trophy: Awarded to Advanced Champion. Donated by: Mrs Wanda Nelson, in memory of her wonderful horse Zarina.

Macedon Ranges Dressage Club Encouragement Award: Awarded to the competitor with the highest percentage in an official competitive test who did not place.

Victorian Dressage Young Rider Squads and Development Program: Most successful combination & runner up from the A, B, C Squads and the Development Program. Must be registered with Squad for the 2019-2020 year.

Australian Sports Pony Registry Rising Star Awards. For riders aged 8–16, in Official Competitive Pony Preliminary and Novice Championships. The highest eligible combination in each Championship will receive a rosette courtesy of the ASPR.

Boutique Equines "Polished Look" Awards: A "Polished Look" is created by paying attention to the finest of details, a touch of Boutique adds finesse to a balanced and elegant presence in the ring...... from brow band to tail, horse and rider should balance and blend to achieve the ultimate "Polished Look". The Polished Look Gold Star Award is awardable for each class level with an overall Diamond Polished Look Perpetual trophy for the competition. Details of how to enter to follow.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The 2020 Victorian Youth Dressage Championships will be conducted in accordance with the current edition of EA Dressage Competition Rules effective 1/1/2020 including amendments and the FEI Rules for Dressage 2020. Competitors are to be aware of the Rules. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete remembering that the 2020 rules will come into effect on 1 January.

Membership and Horse Registration: Riders must be current Competitive members of EA and Horses/Ponies must be registered and owners must be either a Competitive, Participant or Supporter member. Horses and ponies must hold a current Competition Licence.

Participation & Interschool classes: Riders must have minimum Participation membership. Horses do not need to be registered but will be subject to an identity check if selected for random swabbing.

- 1. Victorian Youth Dressage Championships Age: For EA Preliminary to Advanced this event is open to riders 8 years and up to the end of the calendar year they turn 25 on ponies or riders 10 years and up to the end of the calendar year they turn 25 on horses. Competitors must be aware of Rule 4.8.4.1 a Junior of the appropriate age may enter and compete in FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider competitions providing they ride a different horse in each competition.
- 2. **Height**: Horses exceeding 149cm with shoes, 148cm without shoes, Ponies not exceeding 149cm with shoes. Height certificates are required for Pony classes (4.8.3.3)
- 3. Stallions: Stallions are welcome to compete at this event however they must be kept under control by a competent person at all times when either ridden or led. Stallions must be led with a bit or chain in addition to their head collar. Stallions may not be tied to the outside of a truck or trailer but must be stabled or housed in a truck/trailer. Any stallion not considered to be in control by the Organising Committee (OC) will be eliminated from the event. Stallion Green Discs or Green Bridle Numbers must be displayed at all times on saddlecloths, halters. & stables. Riders / handlers under 18 must have formal EADC permission.
- 4. All riders and handlers are reminded that any horse can be dangerous so please give all horses and ponies enough room to pass safely whether you are leading or riding. Please be considerate of all riders and handlers and follow the rules of the arena whilst working horses; that is if you are walking stay towards the middle track in the arena, if you need to stop or check your gear move to the middle of the arena or leave the arena; pass riders coming in the opposite direction left shoulder to left shoulder. If you pass a rider in the same direction allow at least 5 m width. Please look around you at all times and try to be aware of others riding or walking past. Many people unintentionally frighten or distract horses by going too close or by moving too quickly; it is everyone's role to ensure the safety of others.
- 5. **Eligibility**: The qualifying period is the 12 months preceding the closing date of entries. i.e.18/12/18 22/12/19. Please note performances must have been gained in Official Competitive competitions. Interschool performances will only be accepted as qualifying scores, as long as they follow the requirements of the Competitive Judge Table (Rule 3.21) and the rider was a Competitive member at the time. One HC (Hors Concours) result in an official competitive competition only will count as a qualification.
- 6. The following minimum qualifying score as a combination (Rule 10.2 & 10.13) at each level must be achieved for Competitive classes.





Preliminary & Novice: minimum one performance of at least 60%

Elementary, Medium & Advanced: minimum one performance of at least 58%

FEI Pony/Junior: minimum one performance of at least **58**% at the level or equivalent.

FEI Young Rider Tour: minimum one performance of 58% or more at either Advanced or Small Tour level incl FEI Young Rider.

Small Tour: minimum one performance of at least **58**% at Small Tour incl FEI Young Rider.

Medium Tour: minimum one performance of 58% or more at Small or Medium Tour

FEI U25 Tour: minimum one performance of **58**% or more in either FEI Intermediate A, FEI Intermediate B, FEI Intermediate II or Grand Prix (incl. U25 GP)

EA Official Participation classes (Preliminary/Novice) & Interschool classes (Preliminary / Novice):

No minimum performance requirement. Horses / ponies do not need to be registered, but if they are, cannot compete below their official grading.

Pas de Deux: No minimum performance required, horses & ponies do not need to be registered.

- 7. All riders must submit their horse's best three performances in Official Competitive at the appropriate level, between 18/12/2018 to 22/12/2019. See above for minimum performance requirement Performances can be checked & verified on the Equestrian Australia website: http://www.equestrian.org.au/members/search/results or by logging into MyEA. If the result for a performance has not been recorded, then evidence (i.e. a copy of the official results sheet) must accompany the entry to substantiate the performance
- 8. At least one qualifying score MUST have been obtained by the nominated horse/rider combination (refer rule 10.2)
- 9. Horses or ponies may compete in **two (2) consecutive** levels. For example, preliminary/novice, medium/advanced. They may compete in **three**(3) tests only per day, which may include a freestyle test.
- 10. Horse and ponies that enter the FEI level tests can only compete in two levels per day which may include a freestyle.
- 11. **Ranking** (balloting) will be based on the average of the highest percentage of three tests at the particular level, in the 12 months preceding the close of entries. Riders who submit 3 performances (only one of which may be HC) will be considered ahead of those who submit one or two performances. If balloting occurs, preference will be given to Competitive scores.
- 12. Draw: Competitions are limited to 35 competitors. The draw will be posted on the competition website. The OC reserves the right to rank horses if necessary. A revised draw may be necessary the day before the competition to allow for withdrawals. The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition. In the event that National level competitions are oversubscribed all reserve riders entered into Preliminary or Novice classes will be placed into the corresponding Participation level class (and receive a refund of the balance of the entry fee) Ranked reserve riders will be notified if a place in the National class becomes available. Please advise if you do not wish to be automatically placed in the Participation classes if balloted out of the Competitive classes.
- 13. Competitors cannot ride HC at this event
- 15. Callers. As this is a championship event, NO callers are allowed (Participation & Interschool classes excluded)
- 16. **Bridle numbers** (Identification number) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable. Please ensure you have two sets of numbers, one on the horse's bridle or saddlecloth (on both sides) for competition and one on the halter when taking horse out of the stable for walking/hosing down etc. Please include your allocated bridle number when entering. In the case of duplication of numbers, the OC will allocate a temporary # for this event only.
- 17. Entries: All entries to Nominate: See page 9 for details
- 18. Late entries, faxed entries and phone entries will not be accepted.
- 19. Scratchings, Withdrawals and Refunds: Withdrawals. These must be notified to the OC at least 24 hours before the actual day of competition to admin@vydc.com.au or txt to 0417 527412. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless the rider has notified the OC as above and a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 7 days of the completion of the event, submitted to Youth Dressage Event Director, 400 Epsom Road, Flemington, Vic, 3031. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the O.C. Entry fees will be refunded in full for withdrawals before the closing date and for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition or who indicate that they do not wish to compete in the Participation classes. If riders enter for National classes and compete in Participation classes the discrepancy in entry fee will be refunded. A refund of Stable & camping fees is at the discretion of Boneo Park.
- 20. **Medication Control**: This event will be run under current EA Equine Anti Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (2010 and amendments) and the Equestrian Australia National Medication Control Policy. www.equestrian.org.au/medication-control. If you have any queries about these rules please email the EV Branch Medication Control Officer at jancsmith@bigpond.com
- 21. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event
- 22. **Warming-up / exercising**: All riders must wear an approved (2019) safety helmet while mounted. *You are reminded that only the rider entered in the championships is allowed to ride the horse*. A groom may ride the horse at a walk on a long rein only. All horses must be saddled and be





ridden in a bridle during any mounted exercise or competition warm-up. Please do not ride in the camping area. Note all horses must wear their bridle number when out of the stable (ridden, on either side of the horse, or led). Outdoor arenas will be available for use prior to the competition. More information will be contained in the entry information which will be sent to riders. Competitors will have access to competition arenas for familiarisation at set times.

- 23. **Saddlery and Equipment** As per current EA Dressage Rules 2020 including amendments. Note: EA levels up to and including Advanced a whip must not exceed 1.2m in its entirety. Pony riders may only use a whip not exceeding 1.0 m in length. Whips **may not** be carried in any FEI level test.
- 24. **Approved hard hats** must be worn at all times when training, warming up or competing at this event. Current safety approved headgear: refer Rule 5.2
- 25. **Gear check**: All riders must check the current EA Rules for Dressage for saddlery and equipment. A gear check is required before every test (in some cases this will be done at the completion of the test at ringside). Please arrive at the final warm up arena at least 10 minutes before you are due to ride
- 26. Lunging: Lunging is only permitted in the designated lunge rings. Under no circumstances are horses to be lunged in any other area.
- 27. **Presentations**: will take place at the end of the day or at the completion of each competition (depending on the daily schedule). A presentation schedule will be posted on the notice board at the Event Office area; the scoring area at the start of the championships. It is compulsory for all placegetters to be present in competition dress at prize giving.
- 28. **Champion/Reserve**: Champion and Reserve for each level will be determined by using EA Dressage rule 3.19. The Champion and Reserve Champion horse/pony will be required (bridled but not mounted) for presentation
- 29. **Volunteers:** Please note all riders will be given jobs to do during the event, which will include, pencilling, gear checking, marshalling and test collecting. There will be a job list on the web before the event. You will need to make sure that you are aware of your jobs before the event; jobs will be allocated around rider's times in the draw.
- 30. **Freestyles:** All horses must achieve a minimum score of 58% in the qualifying test to be eligible to start in the freestyle. In the unlikely event of a rider not qualifying, they will receive a refund for their freestyle entry.
- 31. **Protests and Appeals:** Objections must be in writing and, other than for abuse of the horse, must be accompanied by a deposit fee of \$150.00 (refer EA Gen. Regs. Art. 163/165/166). Attention is drawn to Rule 1.5 of EA Dressage Rules.
- 32. Music for Freestyles:
- Please submit your music via the online submission system no later than 16 January 2019 to ensure it is received in time for the event. The file name should include the **name of the horse, rider** and **level** of the freestyle.
- The event freestyle submission page can be found at: www.musikur.com.au/uploads/2020/vydc
- MP3 or WAV files are preferred.
- It is recommended that you have a backup available.
- 33. In Freestyles only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown. There are certain movements that are compulsory for each level of Freestyle. Please check the EA rule book for these movements. Time Allowed please refer to specific freestyle test sheets
- 34. Pas de Deux -Costume is optional but should reflect a theme. Boots and approved safety helmet must be worn. No qualifications are required.
- 35. Freestyle music check times will be allocated after the finalisation of the freestyle draw. Competitor times will be allocated by the OC and posted at event office. Onus is on the rider to check their times.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Stabling:

- 1. All stabling requirements must be booked direct to Boneo Park or online at www.boneopark.com.au
- 2. Stables will be available for occupancy from 2pm on Wednesday 16 January 2020. Competitors planning to stay for the Boneo Classic need to advise Boneo Park when booking. Competitors must use the stable allocated by Boneo Park or request a change if absolutely necessary.



BONEO PARK CODE OF CONDUCT

The Boneo Park Equestrian Centre is an exclusive, private facility and in the interests of ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all users the following code of conduct applies. Management at Boneo Park can use discretion at any point in time to determine access to the facilities and are not limited to the code below.

A person must not do any of the following whilst at Boneo Park:

Personal Conduct

- o use indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening language
- o behave in an offensive or indecent manner
- o cause serious alarm or affront to a person by disorderly or unsafe conduct
- o obstruct a person in the performance of that person's work or duties
- o Boneo Park management do not tolerate the use, transfer or possession of illegal drugs on the premises. Anyone found using, transferring or in possession of any non-prescribed illegal drug will be ejected and may be handed over to the police.

Riding Conduct

- Approved AS/ NZ 3838 safety helmets must be worn at all times when riding
- The FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse must be abided by at all times
- Smooth soled and heeled boots are worn.
- · Riding of unsaddled or unbridled horses is prohibited
- Arena etiquette is observed eg:
 - · Left hand to left hand
 - Walking give right of way
 - · Diagonal changes have right of way
 - Uncontrolled horses are removed from the arena

General Conduct

- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- Speed limits must be adhered to at all times
- · Only designated parking areas can be used
- o Horses are not to be tied up to floats or trucks unless using twine and supervised
- o Alcohol must not be consumed by anyone subsequently riding
- Smoking is prohibited in the stable area
- o Children under 14 years must be under strict supervision at all times
- o Horses must be led along laneways not the main drive
- Cars and vehicles are not allowed on horse laneways
- Please be aware that all fences are electric.
- Lights must be turned on before it gets dark

Anyone who does not abide by this code of conduct may be requested to leave the facility. Boneo Park management reserves the right to refuse entry to any individual.







Equestrian Victoria Events: Special Conditions of Entry Applicable Equestrian Australia (EA) documents and requirements

- 1. This Equestrian Victoria (**EV**) event is governed by the Equestrian Australia (**EA**) General Regulations, applicable EA Sports Rules and all relevant EA Codes, policies, bylaws, rules and regulations. - 2. To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current EV member or current member of an EA state branch. You must also satisfy any further membership or registration requirement (including those for any horse entered) referred to in the General Conditions of Entry for the event (Conditions of Entry) and individual disciplines.
- 3. The EA National Sports Rules applicable to the event are referred to in the Conditions of Entry.
- 4. All EA and EV events are subject to the EA Code of Conduct (Code of Conduct). The Code of Conduct can be accessed on the EA website via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/Equestrian Australia Code of Conduct.pdf
 It is important that all members understand that the Code of Conduct also covers parents, guardians and spectators in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EV or an EA state branch. A key aim of the Code of Conduct is to respect the rights of everyone involved, to abide by all EA rules and requirements, to be fair, considerate, honest and professional in all aspects of the sport.
- 5. EA and EV are committed to the protection and welfare of its members. The EA Member Protection Policy (MPP) can be accessed on its website via the following link

- 6. EA and EV events are also subject to various codes and regulations designed to protect the horse, the welfare of which is paramount (Horse Welfare Provisions). Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the Horse Welfare Provisions and ensure that they are complied with. Entrants and Competitors bound by EA documents

Organising Committee

Cancellation and Refund

- 13. EV or the Organising Committee may cancel the event due to catastrophic conditions, disease or force majeure, or for any other reason at its absolute discretion.
- 14. If the event is cancelled after it has commenced there will be no refunds. If the event is cancelled prior to commencement the entrant may be entitled to a proportional refund of the entry fees paid. Any such refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of EV, having regard to the direct or fixed costs for the event.
- 15. Entrants who have provided with their entry an email address and/or mobile phone number will be notified of event cancellation by email and/or text message.
- 16. The refund policy for withdrawal, scratching or change of an entry is set out in the Conditions of Entry.

In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event you agree to release and forever discharge EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof from all claims, proceedings or demands for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.
