# Conditions of Entry

The 2021 Victorian Youth Dressage Championships will be conducted in accordance with the current edition of EA Dressage Competition Rules effective 1/1/2021 including amendments and the FEI Rules for Dressage 2021. Competitors are to be aware of the Rules. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete.

**Membership and Horse Registration: Riders must be current Competitive members of EA and Horses/Ponies must be registered and owners must be either a Competitive, Participant or Supporter member. Horses and ponies must hold a current Competition Licence. Participation & Interschool classes: Riders must have minimum Participation membership. Horses do not need to be registered but will be subject to an identity check if selected for random swabbing.**

- 1. Victorian Youth Dressage Championships - Age:** For EA Preliminary to Advanced this event is open to **riders 8 years and up to the end of the calendar year they turn 25** on ponies or **riders 10 years and up to the end of the calendar year they turn 25** on horses. **Competitors must be aware of Rule 4.8.4.1** a Junior of the appropriate age may enter and compete in FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider competitions providing they ride a different horse in each competition.
- 2. Height:** Horses – exceeding 149cm with shoes, 148cm without shoes, Ponies – not exceeding 149cm with shoes. Height certificates are required for Pony classes (4.8.3.3)
- 3. Stallions:** Stallions are welcome to compete at this event however they must be kept under control by a competent person at all times when either ridden or led. Stallions must be led with a bit or chain in addition to their head collar. Stallions may not be tied to the outside of a truck or trailer but must be stabled or housed in a truck/trailer. Any stallion not considered to be in control by the Organising Committee (OC) will be eliminated from the event. **Stallion Green Discs or Green Bridle Numbers** must be displayed at all times on saddlecloths, halters, & stables. **Riders/handlers under 18 must have formal EADC permission.** Stallions not permitted in interschool classes.
- All riders and handlers are reminded that any horse can be dangerous so please give all horses and ponies enough room to pass safely whether you are leading or riding. Please be considerate of all riders and handlers and follow the rules of the arena set out in the Boneo Park code of conduct.
- 5. Eligibility:** Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, and the effect it has had on the competition year, Dressage Victoria has decided that qualifications will not be necessary for the Victorian Youth Dressage Championships in 2021.
- 6. Starts per day:** Horses or ponies may compete in **two (2) consecutive** levels. For example, preliminary/novice, medium/advanced. However, they may only compete in **three (3) EA tests per day or two (2) FEI tests**, which may include a freestyle test.
- 7. Draw:** Competitions are limited to 35 competitors. The draw will be posted on the competition website. A provisional draw will be posted initially, and a final draw will be posted the day before the competition to allow for withdrawals. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition.** The OC reserves the right to rank horses if necessary.
8. Competitors cannot ride HC at this event
- 15. Callers.** As this is a championship event, **NO callers** are allowed (**Participation & Interschool classes excluded**)
- 16. Bridle numbers** (Identification number) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable. Please ensure you have two sets of numbers, one on the horse's bridle or saddlecloth (on both sides) for competition and one on the halter when taking horse out of the stable for walking/hosing down etc. Please include your allocated bridle number when entering. In the case of duplication of numbers, the OC will allocate a temporary # for this event only.
- 17. Entries: All entries at [www.boneopark.com.au](http://www.boneopark.com.au)** Since there are no qualifications required, entries will be taken on a first come first served basis. Therefore, competitors are encouraged to get their entries in early. Once a class is full a waitlist will be run.
- 18. Late entries** are not allowed.
- 19. Scratchings and Refunds: Scratchings must be notified to the OC at least 24 hours before the actual day of competition to [events@boneopark.com.au](mailto:events@boneopark.com.au).** Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless the rider has notified the OC and a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 7 days of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be refunded. Entry fees will be refunded in full less a \$20 admin fee for withdrawals before the closing date of entries.





20. **Cancellation of the event:** If Boneo Park cancels the event due to COVID 19, extreme weather, low numbers or any other unforeseen circumstances, Boneo Park reserves the right to retain a \$20 admin fee per rider. All other money will be refunded. There will be no refunds once the event has started.
21. **Cancellation of a class:** If Boneo Park cancel a class due to extreme weather conditions, low numbers or any other unforeseen circumstances, the entry fee will be refunded.
22. **Stables/yards/camping:** Can be booked with entries. **Refunds:** More than three days from the event – stable, yard and camping fees will be refunded in full less a \$20 admin fee. Within three days of the event – refunds, less the \$20 admin fee, will be given if the stable, yard or campsite can be filled. If a vet or medical certificate is provided a 50% refund will be given.
23. **Medication Control:** This event will be run under current EA Equine Anti Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (2010 and amendments) and the Equestrian Australia National Medication Control Policy. [www.equestrian.org.au/medication-control](http://www.equestrian.org.au/medication-control). 24. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.
25. **Warming-up / exercising:** All riders must wear an approved (2019) safety helmet while mounted. *You are reminded that only the rider entered in the championships is allowed to ride the horse.* A groom may ride the horse at a walk on a long rein only. All horses must be saddled and be ridden in a bridle during any mounted exercise or competition warm-up. Please do not ride in the camping area. Note all horses must wear their bridle number when out of the stable (ridden, on either side of the horse, or led). Outdoor arenas will be available for use prior to the competition. More information will be contained in the competitor information which will be sent to riders. Competitors will have access to competition arenas for familiarisation at set times.
26. **Saddlery and Equipment** As per current EA Dressage Rules 2020 including amendments. Note: EA levels up to and including Advanced a whip must not exceed 1.2m in its entirety. Pony riders may only use a whip not exceeding 1.0 m in length. Whips **may not** be carried in any FEI level test.
27. **Approved hard hats** must be worn at all times when training, warming up or competing at this event. Current safety approved headgear: refer Rule 5.2.
28. **Gear check:** All riders must check the current EA Rules for Dressage for saddlery and equipment. A gear check is required before every test (in some cases this will be done at the completion of the test at ringside). Please arrive at the final warm up arena at least 10 minutes before you are due to ride.
29. **Lunging:** Lunging is only permitted in the designated lunge rings. Under no circumstances are horses to be lunged in any other area.
30. **Presentations:** will take place **at the end of the day or at the completion of each competition** (depending on the daily schedule). A presentation schedule will be posted on the notice board at the Event Office. **Under normal circumstances it is compulsory for all placegetters to be present in competition dress at prize giving however, depending on COVID 19 restrictions details surrounding presentations will be updated closer to the event.**
31. **Champion/Reserve:** Champion and Reserve for each level will be determined by using EA Dressage rule 3.19.
32. **Volunteers:** Please note all riders will be required to provide a volunteer at the time of entry. Jobs will include pencilling, gear checking, marshalling and test collecting. There will be a job list on the web before the event. You will need to make sure that you are aware of your job before the event; jobs will be allocated around rider's times in the draw.
30. **Freestyles:** All horses must achieve a minimum score of 58% in the qualifying test to be eligible to start in the freestyle. In the unlikely event of a rider not qualifying, they will receive a refund for their freestyle entry.
31. **Protests and Appeals:** Objections must be in writing and, other than for abuse of the horse, must be accompanied by a deposit fee of \$150.00 (refer EA Gen. Regs. Art. 163/165/166). Attention is drawn to Rule 1.5 of EA Dressage Rules.
32. **Music for Freestyles:** Please submit your music no later than 10 January 2021 to ensure it is received in time for the event. It is recommended that you have a backup available. Further details will be provided in the competitor information.



33. In Freestyles only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown. There are certain movements that are compulsory for each level of Freestyle. Please check the EA rule book for these movements. Time Allowed – please refer to specific freestyle test sheets
34. Pas de Deux -Costume is optional but should reflect a theme. Boots and approved safety helmet must be worn.
35. Freestyle music check times will be allocated after the finalisation of the freestyle draw. Competitor times will be allocated by the OC and posted at event office. Onus is on the rider to check their times.

### Participation Classes (Riders up to 25 years of age)

Classes will be scheduled at Preliminary and Novice levels to cater for Young Riders who do not have the required experience for national championship classes. Ribbons to eighth place. Championship rug for Preliminary and Novice overall champions.

- EA Horse registration not required
- Competition licence not required
- Bridle number not required (if necessary, you will be assigned one by the OC)
- EA membership (Minimum participation) required.

### Interschool Classes: Sponsored by Toorak College

Preliminary and Novice classes. Ribbons to sixth place for all divisions i.e Primary / Intermediate / Senior.

Championship rug for Preliminary and Novice champions of each section.

- EA Horse registration not required
- Competition licence not required
- Bridle number not required (if necessary, you will be assigned one by the OC)
- School uniform to be worn
- EA membership (Minimum Participation) required.
- Recognised as a Participation Qualifier for the Victorian Interschools State Championships.

## FEI Classes

**FEI Pony.** Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 12 until the end of the year the rider turns 16 years old. Scheduled classes - FEI Team Competition (2018), FEI Individual Competition (2018) & FEI Freestyle Pony Riders (2009 update 2017)

**FEI Junior.** Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 14 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 18 years old. Scheduled classes FEI Team Test (2018) FEI Individual Competition (2018) & FEI Freestyle Junior (2009 update 2017)

**FEI Young Rider.** Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 21 years old. Scheduled classes- FEI YR Team Competition (Prix St Georges 2019), FEI YR Individual Competition (2018) & FEI Young Rider Freestyle (2009 update 2017)

**Small Tour.** FEI Prix St-Georges (2019), FEI Intermediate 1 (2020), FEI Intermediate 1 Freestyle (2009 update 2017) and is **open to riders of any age as per conditions of entry.**

**Medium Tour.** FEI Intermediate A (2020), FEI Intermediate B (2020), FEI Inter A / B Freestyle (2018) and is **open to riders of any age as per conditions of entry.**

**U25 Grand Prix Tour.** Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 25 years old. FEI Intermediate II (2020), FEI U-25 Grand Prix (2018) & FEI Grand Prix Freestyle (2009 update 2017).

## Freestyles

All horses must achieve a minimum score of 58% in the qualifying test to be eligible to start in the freestyle.

### Pas De Deux

Costume dress is optional. However, boots and approved safety helmet must be worn. Time limit 5 minutes. Equal scores: If two entries receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the leader. Competitors must ride at the level of the most inexperienced rider i.e. If one rider is competing in Medium and the other in Novice, then the combination would compete at Novice level.



## State Teams & Open Teams

Riders may enter the Open Teams competition and State Branches are invited to enter Teams in the State Teams competition. Team entry forms are included in this event schedule.

### State Teams Competition

State Branches are welcome to nominate their state team (10.6.1)

**State / Name Team A** – (Horses Only): one each in Novice 2C, Elementary 3C, Medium 4C

**State / Name Pony Team A** – (Ponies Only): one each in Novice 2C, Elementary 3C, Medium 4C

**State / Team B** – (Horses & Ponies): one each in Advanced 5C, FEI Young Rider Team Test, FEI Intermediate 1 test or EA FEI Young Rider Individual Test.

- The winning team will be the team with the highest total score; the second is the one with the next highest score and so on. This means the percentages (scores) will be added together to determine the team scores.
- Refer EA Dressage rule 10.6.1 for details on the requirements for Team Competitions
- Where there are insufficient entries to enable a State Team to be entered, the smaller states may combine to enter a mixed team.
- State Teams competition entries must be made by the appropriate State Branch in writing by the closing date of entries
- **Declaration of the team to be made in writing to OC by the relevant Chefs d'Equipe or appointed Team Manager by 17:00 Thursday 14 January 2021**
- Chefs d'Equipe must be appointed for Official State Teams.
  - Team Entry Fee is free
  - Places 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup>

### Open Teams Competition

- Teams to consist of 3 riders:
- Riders may compete in more than one Open team
- Horses may not compete in more than one Open team
- A combination which forms part of a State team may also compete in an Open team.
- Open teams may comprise horses and riders from any State.
- A name for the team would be appreciated.

The winning team will be the team with the highest total score; the second is the one with the next highest score and so on. This means the percentages (scores) will be added together to determine the team scores. Team placings will go from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup>

In case of equality of marks, the winning team is the one whose lowest level competitor has the highest percentage over both tests.

Competitors may form their own team and complete details of team members below.

# Prizes and Awards

Championship rugs will be awarded for the following EA levels\*- Preliminary, Preliminary Pony, Novice, Novice Pony, Elementary, Elementary Pony, Medium, Advanced, **EA FEI Pony Tour** (FEI Pony Team Test / FEI Pony Individual Test / FEI Pony Freestyle), **EA FEI Junior Tour** (FEI Junior Team Test / FEI Junior Individual Test / FEI Junior Freestyle), **EA FEI Young Rider Tour** (FEI Young Rider Team Test / Individual Test / YR Freestyle).

**Overall FEI Champion Rug for best combination, based on the highest combined percentage results from all three tests**, from **Small Tour** (Prix St-Georges / Intermediate I Intermediate 1 Freestyle), **Medium Tour** (FEI Intermediate A / Intermediate B / Medium Tour Freestyle) & **U25GP Tour** (Intermediate II / U25 Grand Prix / Grand Prix Freestyle). Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes awarded for all Tours.

## Special Awards and Trophies

**Deb Hamid & Kevin J Hitchins Award:** Awarded to one of the EA/FEI Pony Tour, Junior Tour, Young Rider Tour, Small Tour, Medium Tour or U25 Grand Prix Tour winners who has achieved the highest combined percentage results across all three tests in that Tour. A competitor may only receive this award once. The recipient of the award will receive a magnificent piece of jewellery, hand crafted for this event by Deb Hamid and Kevin Hitchins. This award is valued in excess of \$1500 and is generously donated to recognise Australia's talented young riders who are the future of Australia's Dressage.

**Briana Judge Memorial Trophy:** Awarded to the Highest placed EA & PCAV member in the Championship Classes (Preliminary, Preliminary Pony, Novice, Novice Pony, Elementary, Elementary Pony, Medium, Advanced). The winner will be the highest placed combination in each overall Championship. In the event of a tie, the winner will be the combination with the highest combined percentage from the two tests. Open to Victorian riders only with current memberships with Equestrian Victoria and PCAV. Donated by Mr & Mrs Judge, in loving memory of their daughter Briana Judge.

**Taylor Farley Memorial:** Awarded to the highest placed Victorian Junior (under 18 years) in the Novice Championship. Presented by the Farley family in memory of their daughter Taylor, who was an active and highly successful member of the EV YR Dressage Squad.

**Zarina Perpetual Trophy:** Awarded to Advanced Champion. Donated by: Mrs Wanda Nelson, in memory of her wonderful horse Zarina.

**Macedon Ranges Dressage Club Encouragement Award:** Awarded to the competitor with the highest percentage in an official competition test who did not place.

**Victorian Dressage Young Rider Squads and Development Program:** Most successful combination & runner up from the A, B, C Squads and the Development Program. Must be registered with Squad for the 2020-2021 year. The most successful combination and runner up will be the combination with the highest percentage obtained during the event in all tests, excluding participation, interschool events and freestyles.

**Australian Sports Pony Registry Rising Star Awards.** For riders aged 8-16, in Official Competitive Pony Preliminary and Pony Novice Championships. The highest eligible combination in each Championship will receive a rosette courtesy of the ASPR.

## Disclaimer of Liability

Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Neither Equestrian Victoria, Equestrian Australia, Boneo Park, nor the Organising Committee or their appointed officials accept any liability for any accident, theft or illness to horses, riders, grooms or any person or property whatsoever.

## FEI Code of Conduct - Welfare of the Horse

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the competition horse.



## Boneo Park Code of Conduct

The Boneo Park Equestrian Centre is an exclusive, private facility and in the interests of ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all users the following code of conduct applies. Management at Boneo Park can use discretion at any point in time to determine access to the facilities and are not limited to the code below.

**Personal Conduct:** A person must **not** do any of the following whilst at Boneo Park:

- use indecent, obscene, insulting or threatening language
- behave in an offensive or indecent manner
- cause serious alarm or affront to a person by disorderly or unsafe conduct
- obstruct a person in the performance of that person's work or duties
- Boneo Park management do not tolerate the use, transfer or possession of illegal drugs on the premises. Anyone found using, transferring or in possession of any non-prescribed illegal drug will be ejected and may be handed over to the police.

### Riding Conduct

- Approved AS/ NZ 3838 safety helmets must be worn at all times when riding
- The FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse must be abided by at all times
- Smooth soled and heeled boots are worn.
- Riding of unsaddled or unbridled horses is prohibited
- Arena etiquette is observed eg:
  - Left hand to left hand
  - Walking give right of way
  - Diagonal changes have right of way
  - Uncontrolled horses are removed from the arena

### General Conduct

- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- Speed limits must be adhered to at all times
- Only designated parking areas can be used
- Horses are not to be tied up to floats or trucks unless using twine and supervised

- Horses must be led along laneways not the main drive
- Cars and vehicles are not allowed on horse laneways
- Please be aware that all fences are electric.
- Lights must be turned on before it gets dark

Anyone who does not abide by this code of conduct may be requested to leave the facility. Boneo Park management reserves the right to refuse entry to any individual.
