FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete.
 This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the competition horse.

Prizes

We acknowledge the rise in costs and In order to keep entry fees the same as previous years, the OC has opted to provide either prizes or prize money for first to third places for Official classes. This will be in a ratio of First: \$70, Second: \$65, Third: \$60 (or prizes in lieu). If less than 6 riders in a class the OC may choose not to award rugs for the Championship and may adjust the prizemoney / prizes.

Ribbons will be awarded to 8th place for Victorian Championship classes and Participation classes and to 6th place for Interschool classes (Primary, Intermediate, Senior) *subject to the number of entries

Teams

Riders may enter the Open Teams competition and State Branches are invited to enter Teams in the State Teams competition. Details page 13 Free entry.

Participation Classes (Riders up to 25 years of age)

Classes will be scheduled at Preliminary and Novice levels to cater for Young Riders who do not have the required qualification for national championship classes. Ribbons to eighth place. Championship rug for Preliminary and Novice overall champions. Depending on entries, classes may be split under 16 years, 16 –25 years

- Bridle number not required (if necessary, you will be assigned one by the OC)

Freestyles

All horses must achieve a minimum score of 60% in the qualifying test to be eligible to start in the freestyle. More details are in the Conditions of Entry section.

Demonstration Pas de Deux

Costume dress is optional. However, boots and approved safety helmet must be worn. Time limit 5 minutes. Equal scores: If two entries receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the leader. Competitors must ride at the level of the most inexperienced rider i.e. If one rider is competing in Medium and the other in Novice, then the combination would compete at Novice level.

FEI Tests

FEI Children. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 12 until the end of the year the rider turns 14 years old.

FEI Pony. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 12 until the end of the year the rider turns 16 **FEI Junior**. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 14 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 18 years old.









FEI Young Rider. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 21 years old.

Small Tour: Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 25

Medium Tour. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 25

U25 Grand Prix Tour. Entry age from the beginning of the year the rider turns 16 until the end of the calendar year the rider turns 25 years old.

SPECIAL AWARDS AND TROPHIES

Deb Hamid & Kevin J Hitchins Award: Awarded to the EA/FEI Pony Tour, Junior Tour, Young Rider Tour, Small Tour, Medium Tour or U25 Grand Prix Tour winners who have achieved the highest combined percentage results. A competitor may only receive this award once. The recipient of the award will receive a magnificent piece of jewellery, hand crafted for this event by Deb Hamid and Kevin Hitchins. This award is valued in excess of \$1500 and is generously donated to recognise Australia's talented young riders who are the future of Australia's Dressage.

Briana Judge Memorial Trophy: Awarded to Highest placed EA & PCV member at the Championships. Open to Victorian riders only with current memberships with Equestrian Victoria and PCV. Donated by Mr & Mrs Judge, in loving memory of their daughter Briana Judge. Commemorative rug donated by Tatura Dressage.

Taylor Farley Memorial: Awarded to the highest placed Victorian Junior (under 18 years) in the Novice Championship. Presented by the Farley family in memory of their daughter Taylor, who was an active and highly successful member of the EV YR Dressage Squad.

Zarina Perpetual Trophy: Awarded to Advanced Champion. Donated by: Mrs Wanda Nelson, in memory of her wonderful horse Zarina.

The VYDC Encouragement Award: Awarded to the competitor with the highest percentage in an official competitive test who did not place.

Australian Sports Pony Registry Rising Star Awards. For riders aged 8–16, in Official Competitive Pony Preliminary and Pony Novice Championships. The highest eligible combination in each Championship will receive a rosette courtesy of the ASPR.

Blokes Ride Dressage Too Incentive Award: incentive prizes for male riders at the Championships. Kindly sponsored by Sue and Duncan Terry, Tatura.

Highest EA Freestyle Award: Rug and cash prize for the highest percentage in an EA Freestyle test. Kindly sponsored by Tatura Dressage Inc.

Off The Track: For eligible thoroughbreds who have been claimed on the OTT website www.ottcommunity.com.au no later than one week prior to the close of entries. This is a one off process and will allow you to then be eligible for any OTT class in any discipline with the claimed horse in the future.







CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. The 2025 Victorian Youth Dressage Championships will be conducted in accordance with the current edition of EA Dressage Competition Rules effective 1/1/2025 including amendments and the FEI Rules for Dressage 2025. Competitors are to be aware of the Rules. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete remembering that the 2025 rules will come into effect on 1 January. (If the 2025 Rules are not available a week out from the Championships we will run under the 2024 rules plus amendments.
- 2. Membership and Horse Registration: Riders must be current Competitive members of EA and Horses/ Ponies must be registered and owners must be either a Competitive, Participant or Supporter member. Horses and ponies must hold a current Competition Licence.
- 3. Participation & Interschool classes: Riders must have minimum Participation membership. Horses do not need to be registered but will be subject to an identity check if selected for random swabbing.
- 4. Age: For EA Preliminary to Advanced this event is open to riders 8 years and up to the end of the calendar year they turn 25 on ponies or riders 10 years and up to the end of the calendar year they turn 25 on horses. Competitors must be aware of Rule 4.8.4.1d) a Junior of the appropriate age may enter and compete in FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider competitions providing they ride a different horse in each competition.
- 5. **Height**: Horses exceeding 149cm with shoes, 148cm without shoes, Ponies not exceeding 149cm with shoes. Height certificates are required for Pony classes (4.8.3.3)
- 6. **Stallions**: Stallions are welcome to compete at this event however they must be kept under control by a competent person at all times when either ridden or led. Stallions must be led with a bit or chain in addition to their head collar. Stallions may not be tied to the outside of a truck or float but must be stabled or housed in a truck/float. Any stallion not considered to be in control by the Organising Committee (OC) will be eliminated from the event. **Stallion Green Discs or Green Bridle Numbers** must be displayed at all times on saddlecloths, halters. & stables. **Riders / handlers under 18 are not eligible to apply for exemption in Dressage events.**
- 7. All riders and handlers are reminded that any horse can be dangerous so please give all horses and ponies enough room to pass safely whether you are leading or riding. Please be considerate of all riders and handlers and follow the rules of the arena whilst working horses; that is if you are walking stay towards the middle track in the arena, if you need to stop or check your gear move to the middle of the arena or leave the arena; pass riders coming in the opposite direction left shoulder to left shoulder. If you pass a rider in the same direction allow at least 5 m width. Please look around you at all times and try to be aware of others riding or walking past. Many people unintentionally frighten or distract horses by going too close or by moving too quickly; it is everyone's role to ensure the safety of others.
- 8. **Eligibility**: The only restrictions will be in accordance with the Rules for Dressage, notably 4.8.3.2 together with any age restrictions attached to the FEI tests. **EA Participation classes (Preliminary/Novice) & Interschool classes (Preliminary / Novice):** No minimum performance requirement. Horses / ponies do not need to be registered, and if they are, cannot compete below their official grading. **Demonstration Pas de Deux:** No minimum performance required and horses & ponies do not need to be registered.
- 9. Horses or ponies may compete in **two (2) consecutive** levels. For example, preliminary/novice, medium/ advanced. They may compete in **two (2) tests only** per day. Demonstration Pas de Deux excluded.
- 10. Horses and ponies that enter the FEI level tests (Prix St Georges /YR and up) can only compete in two levels







per day which may include a freestyle and if competing Prix St Georges can only compete in one Advanced test per day.

- 11. Ranking (balloting) will take place in the case of oversubscription. This will be based on performances.
- 12. **Draw**: Competitions are limited to 35 competitors. A reserve list of up to ten competitors will be declared. The acceptance list and the draw will be posted on the competition website. The draw will be updated up to the evening before the competition. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times**the day before the competition. In the event that National level competitions are oversubscribed all reserve riders entered into Preliminary or Novice classes will be placed into the corresponding Participation level class (and receive a refund of the balance of the entry fee) Ranked reserve riders will be notified if a place in the National class becomes available. Please advise if you do not wish to be automatically placed in the Participation classes if balloted out of the Competitive classes.
- 13. Competitors cannot ride Hors Concours (HC) at this event
- 14. Callers. As this is a championship event, **NO** callers are allowed in official tests (**Participation** & **Interschool** classes excluded)
- 15. **Bridle numbers** (Identification number) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable. Please ensure you have two sets of numbers, one on the horse's bridle or saddlecloth (on both sides) for competition and one set on the halter when taking horse out of the stable for walking/hosing down etc. Please include your allocated bridle number when entering. In the case of duplication of numbers, the OC will allocate a temporary # for this event only.
- 16. **Entries:** add link **Late entries**, and phone entries will not be accepted.
- 17. Withdrawals and Refunds: Withdrawals. Before the closing date entries will be refunded in full. Riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition or who indicate that they do not wish to compete in the Participation classes will be refunded in full. There will be no refund within 24 hours of the start of the competition. After the closing date and before 24 hours of the start of the event the OC must be notified by email admin@vydc.org.au or txt to 0417 527412. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless the rider has notified the OC as above and a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 7 days of the completion of the event submitted by email to admin@vydc.org.au or mailed to VYDC, PO Box 616, Werribee, 3030. 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the O.C. If riders enter for National classes but ride in Participation classes, the discrepancy in entry fees will be refunded. A refund of stable & camping fees is at the discretion of Werribee Park. The Administration fee is non-refundable.
- 18. **Medication Control**: This event will be run under current FEI Equine Anti Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (2010 and amendments) and the Equestrian Australia National Medication Control Policy. www.equestrian.org.au/medication-control. If you have any queries about these rules please email the EV Branch Medication Control Officer at jancsmith@bigpond.com
- 19. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event
- 20. **Warming-up / exercising**: All riders must wear an approved safety helmet (rule 5.2) while mounted. *You are reminded that only the rider entered in the championships is allowed to ride the horse*. A groom may ride the







horse at a walk on a long rein only. All horses must be saddled and be ridden in a bridle during any mounted exercise or competition warm-up. Please do not ride in the camping area. Note all horses must wear their identification number when out of the stable (ridden, on either side of the horse, or led). Outdoor arenas will be available for use prior to the competition. Arena familiarisation times and will be posted on the event website.

- 21. **Saddlery and Equipment** As per current EA Dressage Rules 2025 including amendments. Note: EA levels up to and including Advanced a whip must not exceed 1.2m in length including tassel. Pony riders may only use a whip not exceeding 1.0 m in length including tassel. Whips **may not** be carried in any FEI level test.
- 22. **Approved safety helmets** must be worn at all times when training, warming up or competing at this event. Current safety approved headgear: refer Rule 5.2. All helmets must be tagged under current rules.
- 23. **Gear check**: All riders must check the current EA Rules for Dressage for saddlery and equipment. A gear check is compulsory after every test (4.4a). Please arrive at the final warm up arena at least 10 minutes before you are due to ride.
- 24. **Lunging**: Lunging is only permitted in the designated lunge rings. Under no circumstances are horses to be lunged in any other area.
- 25. Presentations: will take place at the end of the day or at the completion of each competition (depending on the daily schedule). A presentation schedule will be posted on the notice board at the Event Office area. It is compulsory for all placegetters to be present in competition dress at prize giving or to apply to substitute a rider on their behalf.
- 26. Champion/Reserve: Champion and Reserve for each level will be determined by using EA Dressage rule 3.19. The Champion and Reserve Champion horse/pony may be required (bridled but not mounted) for presentation.
- 27. **Volunteers:** Please note all riders will be given jobs to do during the event, which will include escribing, marshalling etc. There will be an electronic job list on the web before the event. We need you to volunteer, or you may be allocated jobs anyway. Please check your commitments. Regretfully we need to charge a Volunteer Levy, which will be refunded if you volunteer for a minimum of 2 x 2 hour slots or have helped out in other areas at the discretion of the OC.
- 28. **Freestyles:** All horses must achieve a minimum score of 60% in the qualifying test to be eligible to start in the freestyle. **Music for Freestyles:** Please check the website for more information about submitting music. Must be submitted no later than 9 January 2025 to ensure it is received in time for the event. The file name should include the **name of the horse, rider** and **level** of the freestyle. It is recommended that you have a backup available. In Freestyles only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown. There are certain movements that are compulsory for each level of Freestyle. Please check the EA rule book for these movements. Time Allowed please refer to specific freestyle test sheets. More information on Freestyle competitions can be found in Section 8 of the Dressage Rules.
- 29. Pas de Deux -Costume is optional but should reflect a theme. Boots and approved safety helmet must be worn. No qualifications are required.
- 30. **Protests and Appeals:** Objections must be in writing and, other than for abuse of the horse, must be accompanied by a deposit fee of \$150.00 (refer EA Gen. Regs. Art. 163/165/166). Attention is drawn to Rule 1.5 of







EA Dressage Rules.

31. Freestyle music check times will be allocated after the finalisation of the freestyle draw. Competitor times will be allocated by the OC and posted at event office. Onus is on the rider to check their times.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Stabling:

All stabling requirements must be booked direct to Werribee Park or online at www.wpnec.com.au

Interstate competitors: Interstate arrivals from Tuesday 7 January, afternoon, between 1pm and 5pm.

Local arrivals from Wednesday 8 January, between 9am and 5pm

Horses with behavioural problems in the stables—these MUST be outlined on the Stable Booking Form. This is a risk management and safety matter

No one is to enter the stable of another horse without the owners' permission and no one is to feed/water a horse that isn't theirs. If a person has concerns about another competitor's horse or pony, they should go directly to the events office or Stable Manager to report their concerns

When cleaning stables out waste must be placed in the designated areas (not in the stable aisles).

Stables: \$40 per night. Yards: Free (included in the daily WPNEC Facility Fee) Cleaning fee: \$35 per stable

Camping: Powered: \$30 per night. Unpowered: \$20 per night (please note sites do not have water)

Bookings need to be completed online by 11:59pm Sunday 15 December. WPNEC will then manually allocate these before Christmas.

Event Cancellation

Equestrian Victoria (EV) or the Organising Committee (OC), at its/their absolute discretion, may cancel the event at any time due to force majeure (EG Threatened or abnormal weather conditions including fire, storm or flood), pandemic restrictions, health or safety concerns or any event beyond their reasonable control. IN the event of cancellation, EV or the OC will notify each Team Manager (if any) and competitors at the earliest possible opportunity. Entrants who have provided an email address and/or mobile phone number with their entry form will be notified by email and/or test message.

If the event is cancelled prior to the commencement any refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of Equestrian Victoria in consultation with the Organising Committee having regard to its/their direct or fixed costs and expenses incurred or payable by reason of the cancellation. Event creditors and suppliers with legitimate claims will be paid prior to any refunds being made to competitors. If the event is cancelled after it has commenced there will be no refund.

Release and Indemnity

You acknowledge that horse riding, working with or being around horses can be dangerous. Horses can act in sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt. As a consequence, there is a real risk of damage to property, serious injury or even death. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event you agree to release and forever discharge EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof from all claims, proceedings or demands for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.

- Open teams may comprise horses and riders from any State.
- A name for the open team would be appreciated.
- Riders who are members of a Dressage club may enter as a Club Team.

The winning team will be the team with the highest total score; the second is the one with the next highest score and so on. This means the percentages (scores) will be added together to determine the team scores.

In case of equality of marks, the winning team is the one whose lowest level competitor has the highest percentage over both tests.

Competitors may form their own team.







WERRIBEE PARK NATIONAL EQUESTRIAN CENTRE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre Committee of Management considers it a privilege that you are allowed to bring your dog to this venue. We insist you always keep your dog under effective control and on a leash.

- 1. Approved Safety Helmets must be always worn when riding.
- 2. Cross Country obstacles must not be jumped/used unless a non-riding EA accredited coach of the required level is present.
- 3. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited.
- 4. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited.
- 5. Any person may lead a maximum of two horses while mounted.
- 6. Stallions must always be in the control of a person aged eighteen (18) years or over.
- 7. Horses are not permitted within/upon the quadrangle (between the barn & Indoor 1).
- 8. Horses are not permitted near pedestrian doorways.
- 9. Straw bedding is not permitted on the venue. Only wood shavings/sawdust bedding is accepted.
- 10. Helmets must be worn when riding bikes or unpowered scooters.
- 11. Bicycles are not permitted in the indoor arenas or any stable block.
- 12. Bicycles are not permitted near doors designated as public entrances or exits.
- 13. Electric Scooters are not permitted to be used on the venue.
- 14. Speed limits must be always adhered to, the speed limit at WPNEC is 10km p/h.
- 15. Power leads must not be on the ground or over roadways.
- 16. Construction of portable/tape yards is prohibited.
- 17. Alcohol must not be consumed in the Indoor Arenas, unless purchased from the licensed bar located in Indoor Arena No 1.
- 18. Please observe all signs at the venue.
- 19. Horses must be tied in a safe manner. Horses must not be tied to unattached floats, wheelie bins etc.
- 20. No infrastructure to be erected on WPNEC Grounds without written approval by management prior to event.
- 21. Entry and exit doors to Indoors Arenas must not be obstructed at any time.
- 22. Every event to book at WPNEC must provide their own first aid officials.
- 23. Report any incidents, damages, or safety concerns to WPNEC management immediately.
- 24. Dogs are not permitted on the Cross-Country Course when in use.
- 25. Please call WPNEC Management should you require any assistance with ANY Issue.
- 26. Users who do not comply with these guidelines may be refused future use of WPNEC.
